

Remote Learning Guide for Students: 20 March 2020

As you may now be aware, the government have decided to close all schools and colleges from the end of the day on Friday 20th March 2020, until further notice.

We want to assure you that we are working our hardest to ensure that students can continue to receive the good education that they have been accustomed to. **We are expecting to receive some clarity as to how your learning will be assessed and graded this year, so it is really important that you continue with your learning.**

What you can expect from your teachers:

- Teachers will organise lessons on a weekly basis as usual and provide learning resources to you via your College email and **Moodle**.
- Teachers will respond on line for all questions about the lesson set and will help you as usual. (Teachers will endeavour to answer any queries within a 24hr period during normal working hours.)
- Teachers will give you clear deadlines for work to be completed and this must be uploaded / completed as requested. (**Via Moodle**)
- Teachers will mark and feedback on work submitted.
- Some teachers may be available for video conferences (Instructions to follow)
- Please note that some of the above is subject to the teacher being 'fit and well' enough to work as some teachers may suffer illness during this time.

What teachers can expect from you:

- Log in to **Moodle each day** and ensure you follow the instructions for each course you are enrolled upon. (E.G. It could be an A-level past paper for one subject you take and a BTEC assignment upload for another subject you do.)
- Communicate with staff any needs or concerns.
- **Complete the work** as indicated and ask questions / email concerns if you have any.
- If you are concerned about access to Laptops etc... Please rest assured that there is a Moodle mobile app and the Moodle works on mobile phone browsers and tablets also. (Please note that WORD can be downloaded for free from various app stores)
- Lessons will be substantive ie you will be expected to complete at least **six hours** of study per week, per subject.

We are doing our best to ensure that the students' education is not adversely affected and we need a mature and dedicated effort from the students.
